Free Legal Advice Available in Knox County

KNOXVILLE – Legal Aid of East Tennessee (LAET) will host a **Free Legal Advice Clinic**, Saturday, September 30 from 9:00am to 2:00pm at the Knox County Public Defender’s Community Law office, 1101 Liberty Street in Knoxville.

The Advice Clinic is part of LAET’s Pro Bono Project, and celebrates National Pro Bono Month. Volunteer attorneys from the Knoxville Bar Association will join LAET staff attorneys to provide free advice on various legal matters. “Legal help will be available on a first come, first served basis,” says Kathryn Ellis, LAET’s Pro Bono Project Director. “The public will be able to seek advice on topics such as adoption, child custody & support, divorce, elder law, foreclosure, identity theft, personal injury, VA benefits, wills, worker’s comp, and more.”

The Legal Advice Clinic is co-sponsored by Centro Hispano. A Spanish-language translator will be provided to aid those who have limited English language proficiency.
